

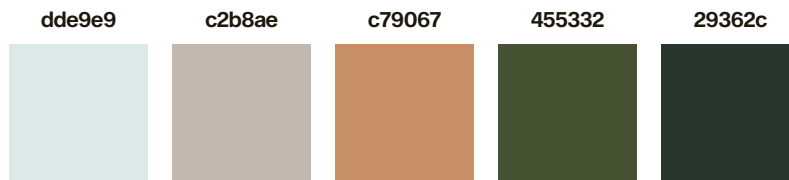
Portknockie

Tucked away in Portknockie, a village at the northeastern Moray coast, is Bow Fiddle Rock. This dramatic, steeply slanted rock rises from the sea, echoing its volcanic formation. Formed from the sheer overlying pressure of sediment layers building up beneath the sea, this quartzite rock dates back to the Neoproterozoic era, approximately a billion years ago.

Bow Fiddle Rock is best viewed from the nearby low cliffs which are framed by jagged rocks that host nesting places for local seabirds. If you're lucky, you might spot a dolphin leaping from the sparkling sea.

Close your eyes and await the sound of the waves crashing onto this extraordinary offshore rock, leaving a foamy trace.



The pairing of sea-foam and tanned Indian khaki attracts the eye towards this nautical colour combination. A softer range in chroma values allows each tone within the palette to breathe. This balance would suit fashion lines that are derived from natural materials like leather or cotton.
